Triple P is a 'positive parenting programme' that has been researched for 30 years and has been designed to give parents easy to understand, practical strategies to help families in all kinds of situations.

Triple P is delivered through individual support or via group, according to level of need. Courses are: Primary (0-12 years) or Teen (12-18 years)

Groups run over an 8 week period and consist of 4, 2 hourly sessions, followed by 3 weekly telephone calls and a final 2 hourly session.

We have run a number of groups and the feedback has been really positive. Some of the comments have been:

"I feel better in myself; I am more confident and shout less, this means I am feeling less guilty"

"I would definitely recommend the course; I think it is useful for anyone, not necessarily those that think they have a problem child"

"I am able to give more praise, this has improved my child's self esteem and she now wants to do more to help"
